# JUSTICE RISING

“It has probably become more dangerous to be a woman than a soldier in an armed conflict” - Major General Patrick Cammaert. This is certainly true of Louise's story. Louise lives in Kalembe, DRC. The day Louise she buried her Father, her Mother left the house, leaving Louise to care for her 5 young brothers.

Shortly after, rebels came to Louise's village. Louise took her younger brothers and ran. With one brother on her shoulders, another on her back and the others in her hands, Louise crossed a deep and dangerous river to escape. Shortly thereafter, Louise was visited by six men who took her by force and raped her. Louise thought her life was over; she felt hopeless.

Soon after, Louise met Justice Rising. They spoke with Louise and provided her with a job in one of their schools. Due to Louise's new income, her brothers went from being malnourished to well fed and thriving. The children Louise is teaching are full of hope and doing well. Louise used to feel rejected by God but today she says she is free.

Mr B referred himself to Bringing Hope at a time when he was struggling with issues relating to conflict, violence and drug related crime.

Bringing Hope supported Mr B straight away; they discussed his past, educational and spiritual considerations, employment, family relationships and being a positive role model and influence.

Bringing Hope continued to support Mr B as he served his 2 year prison sentence for historic drug related charges. During this time Mr B acknowledged that his past lifestyle was one motivated by crime, violence and selfish influences and desires. Mr B started to develop positive ways to build self esteem and confidence which further empowered him to make positive changes on his reentry into society.

As a result of Mr B's hard work and Bringing Hope's support, Mr B's release from prison was welcomed and his reconnection with his family was positive. He was supported in obtaining a job that involves working with young people who are associated with gangs and violence. What's more, Mr B has continued to contribute to discussions about developing an effective approach to engage young people at risk of being involved in the criminal justice system.
